## **Unit Description**

### HLTHPS006 - Assist Clients with Medication

Addresses the provision of physical assistance with medication or supporting clients with self medication in response to an assessed need identified by the client or their substitute decision-maker for assistance with medication, in accordance with the health/support/ care plan and in line with jurisdictional requirements.

### HLTAAP001 – Recognise Healthy Body Systems

Describes the skills and knowledge required to work with basic information about the human body and to recognise and promote ways to maintain healthy functioning of the body.

Smart and Skilled is a reform of the NSW Vocational Education and Training (VET) system. It's helping people in NSW get the skills they need to find a job and advance their careers.

## ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

Fee-free scholarships may be available for eligible students (supporting evidence required) Smart and Skilled Fee-Free Scholarships are maybe available for:

- Young people (aged between 15 and 30) who are eligible for a concession fee\*
- Young people (aged between 15 and 30) who are in, or who are aged between 18 and 30 have previously been in out-of-home care
- People who are experiencing or have experienced domestic and family violence and their dependants.

\* Concessions are available to learners receiving the following Commonwealth benefits and allowances: Age Pension, Austudy, Carer Payment (conditions apply), Disability Support Pension, Farm Household Allowance, Family Tax Benefit Part A – maximum rate, Newstart Allowance, Parenting Payment (single), Sickness Allowance, Special Benefit, Veterans' Affairs Pensions, Veterans Children Education Scheme, Widow B Pension, Wife Pension, Widow Allowance, Youth Allowance. Conditions may apply - please contact BCA National for more information.
