


Use a Companion Card

A Companion Card is a card from the government.


It lets your support person come with you for free.

Some cinemas have


ramps





a special seat for wheelchairs




• a seat next to you for your support person.



You can ask for an audio description.


Audio description

• tells you what is happening in the movie.




Sensory-friendly screening

A **sensory-friendly screening** is a special setting for movies.



The lights stay on a little.



The sound is not too loud.



You can get up or talk if you need to.



Sensory-friendly screenings are good for people who

do not like loud sounds



do not like bright lights



need to move or make noise.



Pick the best seat for you

You can



sit near the door



sit at the back.



move around.



Ask for a quiet room

You can go there if you feel **overwhelmed**.

things feel too loud or too fast






Accessible bathrooms

An accessible bathroom has




big doors

• space to move in a wheelchair




help buttons.

• it is easy to use for everyone.




Assistance animals

If you have an assistance animal, you can bring them with you.



Ask if there is space for them to sit or lie down.




You can bring papers that say the animal is allowed.






Audio description
